

GET LOUD FOR CHILD CARE

Social media is one of the most direct lines we have to candidates. With one post, you can get your story, issue, or question (*wink*) directly into the feed and inboxes of your local candidates.

In this resource guide you will find sample social media copy, scroll-stopping graphics, and detailed instructions on how to reach your candidates on social and get them to prioritize bold solutions to fix our broken child care system.

Your mission is simple: Use your social media platforms to ask candidates the question, "Will you prioritize child care in your first 100 days in office?"

HERE'S WHAT TO DO

CREATE A POST

Post <u>this graphic</u> and add a caption (we've already cooked one up for you!), asking your candidate if they will prioritize child care in their first 100 days in office.

2 LET'S GET PERSONAL

In a few sentences, share your story in the caption. Your story is a powerful tool for getting candidates to pay attention, so in a few sentences tell us what the child care crisis has cost you and your family.

Sample: It's hard to be a mom in America today. I have two kids under age 5 and I pay more per month for child care than I earn from my full time job. And I know I'm not alone – all of my friends are struggling to pay for child care. What is your plan to solve our child care crisis, and will you prioritize it in the first 100 days if you are elected?

"What is your plan to solve our child care crisis, and will you prioritize it in the first 100 days if you are elected?"
